
Dear Surya:

On behalf of the Bamboo Guild and the people of Hawaii, I wish to express sincere appreciation for your numerous contributions during your brief stay with us. Your willingness to enthusiastically participate in so many of our programs inspired all of us.

I know that a representative of the National Tropical Botanical Garden will be writing a separate letter to you concerning your activities at their facility, so I will not enumerate them here. However, I believe it might be useful, for the record, to recount the specific categories of projects in which you were engaged with the Bamboo Guild:

- 1) Participation in an international permaculture workshop, where you successfully demonstrated the utility of bamboo as an integral partner in biodiversity;
- 2) Presentation of techniques of planting, use, and conservation of bamboo in a specific site;
- 3) Made a major presentation to the Garden Island Resource Conservation and Development organization on bamboo as a part of the reforestation program on Kauai;
- 4) Actively participated in the meetings and activities of the Forestry Committee of the Garden Island Resource Conservation and Development, Inc.;
- 5) Gave demonstrations and made videos on techniques of propagating bamboo, including splitting, layering and planting;
- 6) Gave demonstrations and made videos on the uses of bamboo in construction;
- 7) Taught the varieties of uses of bamboo in landscaping and soil conservation;
- 8) Presented the elements of bamboo nursery construction and management;
- 9) Taught the various practical uses of indigenous plant materials, from foodstuff through medicinal uses, structural applications, and as a decorative element;
- 10) Contributed to the development of a public educational program on the concepts of biodiversity and resource management;
- 11) Assisted in the construction of a public and professional relations program for the various scientific programs of the Bamboo Guild.

In addition to the scientific guidance that you generously provided in these activities, you gave us a new dimension of respect for our environment. These contributions will continue to have an important impact on our islands for many years to come. We are grateful, and sincerely hope that there will be an opportunity for you to visit with us again in the near future.

Dear Mr. Suryadharna,

I am writing in support of your proposal to conduct a project on bamboo conservation strategy through propagation under the auspices of the Kauai-based Hawaii Bamboo Guild. This proposal has been submitted to a joint project between the Indonesian Department of Education and Culture, Directorate General of Higher Education and the World Bank for a three-month study visit to Hawaii.

The project will cover international airfare, health insurance, room and board and a stipend for daily incidentals. The Bamboo Guild, with Mr. Larry Rueter as contact person, will host you and your project during your stay in Hawaii and arrange for room and board.

The National Tropical Botanical Garden, a privately supported, non-profit, research and education institution, headquartered on the island of Kauai will provide access to an extensive reference library and herbarium, as well as to the living collections in the Lawai and Allerton Garden.
