hature. You will be asked to describe things such as a restaurant you enjoy eating in, a book you have read recently or something you cannot live without. You will also be asked to relate what you are talking about, to yourself—e.g. "say why you choose to eat in this restaurant" or "say what you enjoyed about the book".

How to do Part 2

Read the topic carefully

Make sure you have understood what you need to talk about

Don't write on the topic card

Make sure you cover all parts of the topic card

Organize your talk by following the order on the card

Make sure you use examples from your own life, it's much easier to talk more fluently about your own experiences

For example

Describe a restaurant you enjoy eating in.

You should say:

- 1. Where this restaurant is
- 2. What kind of menu it has
- 3. What other feature it has

And explain why you choose to eat there.
